### **Grocery Certificate Volunteers Needed!**

The grocery certificate service provides added revenue for the church, and works closely with the UUCG Treasurer and Board. Volunteers need to contact Margaret in the Church Office.

**SHOP FIRST AT UUCG** Scrip and Grocery cards are an easy way to support UUCG by purchasing cards for items you **already plan to buy**. You buy the card and receive the full face value and the church receives a rebate directly from the merchant. The rebates range from 2% to 16% and they all add up. King Soopers cards can be refilled at the store which means you can use your credit card for your purchase and get those mileage points we know you love! How can you help make this program a success?

- Use your grocery card to fill your gas tank and your prescriptions!
- Buy scrip cards for merchants you always frequent.
- Use scrip cards for **teacher gifts** or for school supplies.
- Special order cards for large purchases, appliances, or computers.
- Scrip Cards fit nicely in a birthday or anniversary card.

Don't forget to refill your King Soopers Cards. The church receives 5% of your purchase. Buy grocery cards for on Sunday's for Sprouts 5% and Safeway 4%.

Ask Hollis about all of the other gift cards available that are purchased about every 6 weeks but orders can be taken at any time.

### **Reviving the UUCG Birthday Fund**

Our first UU Principle affirms "the inherent worth and dignity of every person." This means that, "It's a blessing you were born," as the catchy song we sing says! Blessings lead to gratitude, and the privilege of "paying it forward." We say in our service each week, "we are blessed, and so we are called to be a blessing."

Have you recently been blessed with another year of life? Have you been blessed by someone else's life? Either way, the tradition of the UUCG Birthday Fund offers an opportunity to bless UUCG with an

amount of money equal to the number of years of life (your own, or that of a person who has blessed you with their presence).

Our seventh UU Principle affirms “respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.” Maybe you would like to contribute in honor of another year in the life of your beloved pet, a beloved tree/river/garden, or some other way to honor the interdependent web of life?

Maybe you would like to honor the loss of a life you held dear (person, animal or nature)?

Maybe you would like to begin teaching your children about honoring the gift of life, UU principles, generosity, paying it forward, etc. by helping them contribute on their birthdays, or that of a pet or another part of the interdependent web when you are out in nature?

Simply write a check with “birthday fund” in the memo, or place cash in an envelope with “birthday fund” written on the outside. Each month as we report in the Unifax how much money we’ve taken in with pledges and offerings in the plate, we will also report how much we’ve taken in for our Birthday Fund.

Please help us revive this UUCG tradition which reminds us of the quote by Albert Schweitzer, “What we call love is in its essence reverence for life.

### **A Note from Sarah Gostenik:**

I felt good about what my team and I were able to accomplish in a short week in Greece, from bringing aid and distributing to many sites, helping the Greek economy by purchasing much needed items, like food, clothes, towels, shoes, toothpaste and toothbrushes, socializing with children through a Vakna art project and taking them to the Athens planetarium, purchasing a kitchenette at Ikea for a new women’s center (thanks Centennial Rotary Club of Greeley for the \$500!), sorting donations, and cleaning up an empty lot, turning it into a garden space. Working with and volunteering with refugees helps me not take anything for granted. Refugees have gone through so much, yet I’ve never seen them cry, they stay strong and resilient and are quick to offer their smiles and space, along with food, tea or Coca-cola. Simple pleasures that can bring people together from all walks of life. Thanks again to everyone who gave support towards this trip, it's greatly appreciated!
