Ministerial Musings

Spirituality has been on my mind a lot recently. I had a conversation with someone who was wondering about the connection of spirituality and justice work and it got me to thinking too. There's a good reason that the author of Ecclesiastes observed that one person sharpens another like iron sharpens iron: we become keener in our insights and clearer in our thoughts when we are with one another and engaged in conversation and community. It was true three thousand years ago and it is true today. My view on spirituality is informed by Aristotle's discussion of Eudaimonia, which can be translated as happiness but more accurately means the good or healthy spirit. For Aristotle, humans were filled with a spirit (or the breath of life) that could have many different manifestations. This rather corporal understanding of spirituality is the one that I myself tend to embrace. The one I feel and experience daily, here and now. My own cosmology is such that I don't tend to worry about a world of the here and now and a spirit world. I believe that whatever separations lie between realms, known or unknown, they are likely very permeable. Because of this, spirituality and my present state are deeply interconnected. So the theology that I embrace, the meaning that I have made, should cross between those two spheres of my existence. Hence, the justice work that I engage in is just as linked to my spirituality as a sitting meditation practice. I believe that a practice of good spirituality is one that enhances everyday living and helps inform our moral decision making. When we are rightly configured, mind, body and spirit, we feel Aristotle's sense of Eudaimonia. It is important that we continue to emphasize all aspects of these concerns which intersect in our lives simultaneously on this place in the path we find ourselves.

Another great month past on this really remarkable year. April really did have some very special moments for our church. We were able to welcome our new music director Renee into our worship services and got the first chance to hear a bit of our choir again which was really a wonderful thing. The Klezmer concert allowed us to welcome back some old friends and to showcase our building once again. The Earth Day event went off very well thanks to the work of our Social Justice ministry. Leadership, including myself, had the opportunity to touch base with many of the congregation before we started to finalize our pledge outlook for the coming year. I felt very lucky to be able to have that conversation with you as we prepare for what lies ahead. We had a long attending couple decide that this month was the perfect time to become full members of the church and to top it all off, we had the best attendance on the Easter service that we've had in more than a year. Blessings were abounding in April!

This month will be the eighth month that I have been lucky enough to serve as your contract minister. It has really been an absolute pleasure. We seem to be in a very sweet spot right now in our church as the life of the church continues to grow. I have been especially thankful of so many of you who have brought your passions and interests to our community and commingled them with the life of the church. Some of those interests are long standing and well established like Hollis and Ana's leadership in the Social Justice Ministry, but there are a bunch of new things happening to like the meditation and dharma group lead by Janelle, the writer's group headed by Ruth, and, just this month, an invitation for afternoon walking lead by Sharlene and Jane. I'd like to add another opportunity to get together as a community and maybe do a little theological work too, so I'm proposing holding a movie night each month on fourth Monday of the month at 6 p.m. We'll watch a movie in the sanctuary and then afterwards have a discussion for those that can stay. This first month we'll be a bit on the nose and watch the Ken Burn's documentary Defying the Nazis: The Sharp's War. The movie tells the story of Wait still and Martha Sharp, a Unitarian minister and his wife from Wellesley, Massachusetts, who boldly committed to multiple life-threatening missions in Europe saving hundreds of refugees. One final and important on-going offering: if you are new to the church, keep in mind that I offer a class on deepening connection with an eye on the path toward membership every six weeks or so (the next one is May 5th). This is a great introduction to Unitarian Universalism to some of the principles we affirm and promote and also the history of our congregation. It takes about an hour and a half and also gives you the chance to meet some of the others who are feeling a bit like you. The form for signing up is online at


A Very Special Thanks
